The scientist Dr Harry Dalton (played by Pierce Brosnan) is sent to Dante's Peak to study the volcano. He finds dead plants and animals. He thinks the mountain is not a safe place to be for people, and he tries to get the local council to prepare an evacuation. But nobody listens to him. They are afraid businesspeople will not invest in the town if they think it is a dangerous place. Even Dalton's boss, Dr Paul Dreyfuss, is against him. The only person who believes him is the mayor of the town, Rachel Wando (Linda Hamilton), a single mother of two children.

Soon, the mountain begins to cause serious problems and the people in the town realise the big danger of the volcano. But it's too late. The volcano erupts. Day becomes night; air turns

to fire; buildings fall; people panic as they run for their lives through the ash and dust. Harry and Rachel discover that Rachel's children have gone up the mountain to try and save their grandmother. They follow them. Fighting against the volcano, Harry, Rachel, and the children are the only people left in the destroyed town, and that's not the end – the second eruption is still to come.

If you've seen one disaster movie, you've seen them all. You can guess who will die and who will live and of course who will fall in love. But the action is fast and the special effects are still fun to watch after ten years. Okay, if you look carefully, you can see that the cars on the falling bridge are models with no drivers inside. 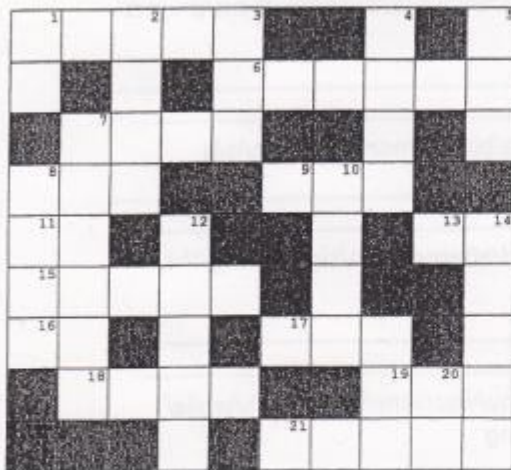
